## SHOULD WE BE WORRIED ABOUT CHILDREN IN MONTEREY COUNTY?

Absolutely.

Forty-five percent of students are scoring below the basic level in English language arts and math. Fifty-four percent of high school graduates are entering college requiring remediation.

Lost learning over the past year due to Covid-19 has increased the literacy gap among children who are already as much as two years behind in school.



Literacy is a measure of a community's economic health and vitality. It allows young people to see all the options and opportunities available to them. Literacy is cited as the top issue in reducing gang violence in our community. Research shows that children who cannot read by the 4th-grade are among the first to drop out of school. Children from homes with high literacy skills have greater success in school and at work.
