Throughout the year, students regularly share with their Read to Me Project program coordinator about their experiences of reading to the little ones at home.

If I leave my backpack open, my nephew will grab the book out of the backpack and bring it to me. It just tells me he likes all the books. - 6th grade girl reading to 2 year old

My little brother repeats the words I say when I'm reading to him. And he points to the pictures to ask what's that? what's that? - 5th grade boy reading to 4 year old

My little sister wants me to read the book a lot of times and then when I say I don't want to anymore, she gives the book to my mom for her to read it. My mom is learning new English words just like my sister. - 4th grader reading to a 2 year old

When students share their thoughts about the program, they are shining a light into their homes for us to see how the program is helping them, the little ones, and even their parents.

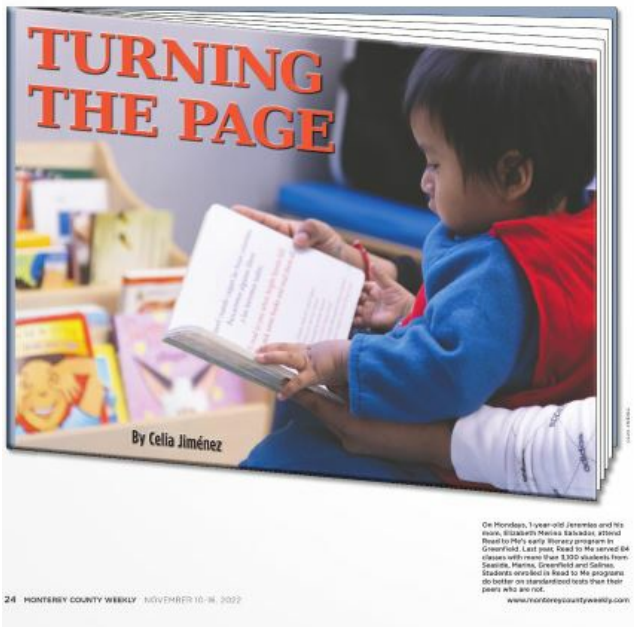
