Hard Truth: WHAT CAUSES ILLITERACY?

- Parents with little schooling;
- Lack of books at home and lack of stimulation as to the importance of reading;
- Starting behind in school;
- Struggling in school and dropping out. (Students who cannot read proficiently by the 3rd grade are four times more likely to drop out of school. 2/3 of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of 4th grade will end up in jail and/or on welfare. Over 70% of inmates in the U.S. cannot read above the 4th grade level.)
- Difficult living conditions, including poverty;
- Learning disabilities, such as dyslexia



Teachers basically have 360 days for teaching 1st and 2nd graders how to read. But a majority of time is spent helping their students develop foundational literacy knowledge rather than teaching the grade level reading curriculum. Third graders are expected to be able to read fairly accurately and fluently, decode dozens of multisyllabic words, such as pho-to-graph and est-i-mate, as well as read some irregularly spelled words such as enough, especially, and confusion. Sadly, only 30% of children in Monterey County are ready to be reading by the third grade.

Expert educators say illiteracy is preventable, but for decades remedial programs have been necessary at every grade level. Covid-19 has shone a very bright light on the issue that the pandemic has exacerbated, leading to more talk about the need to prevent illiteracy to begin with. *Illiteracy is one of the most solvable issues!*

Read to Me Project is a prevention-based solution for preschoolers in low literate families. The program provides them with the precursory early literacy knowledge that is necessary for learning how to read. This is why Read to Me Project was founded 11 years ago and why we are asking for support.

Funding support, YES, PLEASE. (Schools pay just 25% of the total per class costs for program implementation.)
