

As an advocate for early literacy, you recognize the importance of Read to Me Project's annual request for help with the continuing effort to close the literacy gap among thousands of children in disadvantaged, low literate families.

Expert educators say illiteracy is preventable. Remedial support programs are not designed to address the root cause of what has for decades been called a crisis. Among the estimated 550 4th-6th grade classes in Monterey County, 461 are low performing, defined by 50% or more students in a class who do not meet grade level standards.

The Read to Me Project emerged in 2011 as a proactive response, initiated by a speech and language specialist who had witnessed the distressing reality of young children beginning kindergarten with a significant deficit in fundamental literacy skills. The lack of early literacy was hindering their capacity for learning to read.


Every child, regardless of their background, deserves an equitable start in school. Yet, in Monterey County alone, a staggering 70% of children enter school at least two years behind in basic vocabulary, language skills, and cognitive development – all pivotal prerequisites for mastering the art and science of reading.

With your help, the Read to Me Project will continue to:

- Prepare more pre-school aged children in low-literacy households to start school on par with their peers, primed for learning to read, while student participants improve their reading skills.
- Deliver crucial training to parents with limited literacy skills, equipping them with tools and information to foster their
