



THE 2018/2019 RESULTS ARE IN!

We are very pleased to provide you with Read to Me Project's Annual Report for 2018/2019.

In brief: Read to Me Project served 5 school districts; 20 schools and 126 classrooms.1,579 students read to 1,859 little ones ages 6 months to 5 years.

One component of annually measuring and evaluating the program is to survey participating students at the end of every school year.

Students told us their little one learned "a lot" during the year, citing alphabet, numbers, colors and more words as some of the most common new learnings. The majority of students also reported that Read to Me Project has helped them to become a better reader.

A pop-up exhibition of the 7-Day Sunrise Challenge, where more than 100 people from around the world woke up early to greet the sun for seven consecutive days boosting creativity and productivity in their lives.

Exhibition will also include sunrise paintings. Proceeds of sunrise prints and paintings benefit the Read to Me Project, an early literacy program that helps underserved children achieve kindergarten readiness and a lifetime of literacy.

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My name is Myra Villagomez (left) and my two sons, Christian and Jacob, along with their cousins Joanna and Jonathon have benefited tremendously from the Read to Me Project.

My children have become excited about reading. At night, they race and come back with a stack of books eager to read and be read too. Jacob, 3 yrs. old, has developed academic language and improved his sentence structure. Christian, 5 yrs. old, has also improved his academic language, sentence structure, decoding high frequency words, and is able to read kindergarten level books.

My children will often select reading instead of watching television or playing with their toys. It has gone from being a night routine to something they enjoy doing. As a parent, I love seeing their faces when they come running down the hall with books wanting to read with joy, excitement, and laughter. Reading has been transformed from a boring "must do" into something fun and exciting.
