## **Program Update**

More than three thousand 4th, 5th and 6th grade students and little ones ages 6 months to 5-years-old are participating in the 2023/2024 program. Throughout the year, each student has access to 160 different books to borrow for reading out loud to their little ones at home. To encourage continued reading habits and to help create an athome library, volunteers and staff helped students wrap more than 800 new books to give as gifts to their little ones at our popular Holiday Book Wrap event in December.





RtMP's parent education program is underway with teen parents through a continuing partnership with South Monterey County Joint Union High School District. New collaborations are in development with a few key organizations to expand RtMP's ability to reach parents of little ones and we expect to provide more details in the coming months.
